4 - ??? : Chillin' and Grillin' at Bob Goodell's Westminster Farm. Bring a side dish or dessert to share (tell us if it will be salad, hot dish if possible - doesn't have to be large: enough for yourself and one other person,) chips, pasta salad, potato salad, tossed salad, cold plate, dessert, etc. Bob will provide the meat, and he asks that we **bring our own drinks** and if you live in the area or are driving to reunion, **please bring some lawn chairs**. To reach Westminster Farms: Take Exit 5 off US 91 North onto Route 5 and go South for about 2.5 miles. It will be on your right (same side as Richard's). If you are going from Richard's, go north and start looking on the left for the entrance to Westminster Farms. If you have a GPS, program 4187 US Route 5, Westminster, VT.

Westminster Farm is a family-farm operation located in the scenic Connecticut River Valley of Vermont, owned by the Goodell family: Clayton and his sons Jason and Shawn. Also involved in the operation of Westminster Farms is Clayton's brother, Robert Goodell, and his son, Hugh, and daughter, Beth Adreon. Clayton and Robert's sister, Jill Garland, manages the office.

Westminster farms has a milking herd of 650 Holstein cows and supporting live stock of 600 for a total of 1250 animals all housed in energy efficient barns, using natural ventilation as well as an anaerobic digester to convert our manure into electricity reducing our impact on the environment, including manure and wastewater run-off.

The farm benefits the local community, our state, our country and our earth. Locally, we will reduce the odor associated with dairy farming. Making the facility more appealing for our greater community, the project allows us to generate enough electricity to power 120 houses per month from a renewable energy source. Also, we will be able to use the composted material as bedding for our animals, eliminating the use of sawdust and limit the impact on our forests. This locally produced power source will allow the State of Vermont to take one step closer to being energy efficient, not relying on out-of-state energy sources to light houses and run businesses. The improved nutrient management will help to reduce our impact on green house gases, water pollution and the natural environment.

The family commitment to the project, and our obligation to making our farm sustainable for future generations, has encouraged us to be proactive in protecting the environment and ensuring that the family farm will continue to be a viable career option for our children and grandchildren. It is this commitment that the Goodell family has undertaken to ensure that the farm will remain for generations to come with less of an impact on the environment.
